NSNA Convention 2009



Nine Cypress College students attended the NSNA 57th Annual Convention in Nashville, Tennessee. The theme was "Making it BIG: Nursing Students Stepping Up and Stepping Out." Each semester was well represented as students learned about the national organization and their leadership role within NSNA. The event was held at the Gaylord Opryland Convention Center, with everything contained in one location. Nursing students from all over the country participated in plenary sessions (a large gathering with a speaker), the NSNA delegation, workshops, elections, an auction and even a first night party (a hoedown!). The student delegates were busy learning the ropes, however there was time for food, fun and a trip to the Grand Ole' Opry.

Students were surprised with how much they had in common with other students from across the country, discussing issues such as care plans, demanding instructors and clinical challenges. The delegates discussed issues important to student nurses in 24 resolutions, including: global health in nursing curriculum, music therapy, MRSA standards, standardized patient hand-off report, adolescent pregnancy prevention. Faculty members Sally McNay, RN, MSN and Dr Noreen Obrien, RN, PhD, challenged the Cypress group to approach one of the many microphones and speak their minds — not an easy task, but several rose to the occasion. Students had an assignment to reflect on the conference.

Here is what they had to say:

Graduating senior Crystal Klewein indicated that, her ideas about furthering her education are now more concrete. "The central theme of the conference was leadership, being a change agent. Furthering my education will help me to become that change agent."

First semester student Jennifer Russell was surprised at the educational offerings beyond ADN. "... I learned to make my time in school enjoyable, as well as getting the education. I don't have to be stressed out all the time. I am taking the time to reflect on what I've learned and to share it with my classmates and friends."

Natalie Gettler said, "I want to inspire people to join NSNA. I really had no idea that NSNA was so huge. I really want our chapter to be strong and known."

President Brittany Hagge concludes with, "Nursing is such a meeting of worlds: science, compassion, research and humility." +

KinderCaminata

KinderCaminata is a combination of the German word for children, *Kinder*, and the Spanish word, *Caminata*, which translates as "promenade" or "to walk at an event." Through collaboration among Cypress programs, KinderCaminata has become a walk through a college dreamscape of career booths, entertainment and real-life encounters with business and professional role models from the college. Kindergartners talk to fire fighters, police officers, teachers, nurses, Cypress athletes and more.

Hundreds of kindergartners filled up the Cypress College campus to explore aspects of career oriented programs offered at Cypress College. Our CNSA group gave these Kindergartners an opportunity to listen to their own heart beat by listening through a stethoscope. The nursing students

(from different semesters) also taught children the importance of handwashing. While singing the "ABC Song," the students were taught to rub their hands together as long as the song lasted.

Everyone Must Have CPR!

You will need your American Heart Association — Healthcare Provider CPR certification prior to starting clinical. Be sure that the class is for healthcare providers and not for regular citizens of the community. If you take the wrong class, you will have to take the healthcare provider class all over again at an additional expense!

CNSA has a perfect solution. We have contracted with Heart-to-Heart (a CPR licensing company) to give a CPR course to NSNA members at an extremely discounted rate of \$25. This course would normally be \$65 or more. This is an effort by CNSA to increase our number of members, which increases our voting power.

The course will be conveniently located at Cypress College in the Health Science Building August 13 (the same day as Family Night) from 1:00pm-4:30pm (room TBA). Sign up with CNSA at orientation.
